Uganda



The collaboration between MASE and the Ugandan Ministry of Water and Environment began with the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding in December 2023.

Uganda is a landlocked country in Southern Africa. Its territory is mostly flat in the North and mountainous in the Southwest. The capital city, Kampala, located in the Southeast, is bordered by Lake Victoria, the largest in Africa. The equatorial Climate is characterized by generally high temperatures and abundant rainfall, with alternating rainy and dry seasons, which significantly affect agricultural activities.

The country boasts a rich natural heritage with forests, lakes, rivers, and fertile soils, but this is at risk due to overexploitation, deforestation, soil erosion, and water pollution in lakes and rivers, especially severe in urban areas.



THE CONTEXT OF COOPEERATION



The Memorandum of Understanding in the field of sustainable development between MASE and the Ugandan Ministry of Water and Environment was signed on December 4, 2023, in Dubai, during COP28.

The main areas of intervention outlined in the agreement include: integrated water resource management (SDG 6), access to energy (SDG 7), the adoption of sustainable consumption and production models (SDG 12), the fight against climate change (SDG 13), biodiversity protection (SDG 15), and the strengthening of international cooperation (SDG 17).
